

## How to reach Bolzano/Bozen

## By plane

Bolzano has a small airport (<a href="https://www.bolzanoairport.it/en/">https://www.bolzanoairport.it/en/</a>) and the regional airline Sky Alps (<a href="https://www.skyalps.com/en/">https://www.skyalps.com/en/</a>) offers flights to/from several European cities. The nearest larger airports are Innsbruck (Austria) and Verona (Italy). Other international airports you can fly to are Bologna, Bergamo, Milan, Venice (Italy) and Munich (Germany). From these airports, you can travel to Bolzano/Bozen by shuttle bus, by train or by car. On the websites of these airports you can find the information regarding the bus transfer to/from railway stations. See also the information below.

## By bus and/or train

Bolzano/Bozen can be reached easily from Munich (Germany) and Innsbruck (Austria) as well as from Verona, Bologna, Bergamo, Venice and Milan (Italy). Bus shuttles from these airports to Bolzano can be booked online at <a href="https://www.altoadigebus.com">https://www.altoadigebus.com</a>. Flixbus runs buses from various German, Austrian and Italian cities to Bolzano/Bozen. More information and timetables on <a href="https://www.flixbus.com">https://www.flixbus.com</a>.

The railway connections are the following:

**From north:** From Munich (Germany), Eurocity-trains run every two hours during the day directly to South Tyrol via Innsbruck (Austria). Information and timetable on <a href="www.bahn.de">www.bahn.de</a>. From Innsbruck (Austria), there are several daily regional trains to Bolzano/Bozen. Information and timetable on <a href="www.oebb.at">www.oebb.at</a>.

**From east:** From Vienna via Villach to Lienz (Austria), by regional trains further to South Tyrol. Information and timetable on <a href="https://www.oebb.at">www.oebb.at</a>.

**From south:** Train connections from Rome (direct fast trains), Bologna (direct fast trains and regional trains), Milan (one direct fast train/day; fast and regional trains with change in Verona) and Venice (fast and regional trains with change in Verona). **From west:** From Switzerland through Innsbruck or Milan to Bolzano/Bozen. More information on <a href="https://www.sbb.ch">www.sbb.ch</a>.

## By car

**From north:** Coming from Munich you take the direction to Innsbruck (A12 Inntalautobahn) via Rosenheim and Kufstein. At Innsbruck you follow the motorway A13 (Brennerautobahn) until you reach the Passo del Brennero/Brennerpass, there the motorway passes into the Italian Autostrada del Brennero (A22).

**From west:** Via Ulm - Kempten - Füssen - Fernpass and Imst you reach Landeck. You take the Passo Resia/Reschenpass-state road and reach the Val Venosta/Vinschgau in South Tyrol. Coming from Bregenz you reach South Tyrol via Feldkirch - Arlberg - Landeck and the Passo Resia/Reschenpass. Coming from Switzerland you also can reach South Tyrol via Zürich - Landquart - Klosters - Vereinatunnel - Zernez and the Ofenpass.

From east: Via Klagenfurt - Lienz - Innichen you take the state road of Val Pusteria/Pustertal.

**From south:** If you come from Rome, Milan or Venice you have to follow the direction to Verona. There you take the motorway A22 (Autostrada del Brennero) and reach South Tyrol via Trento.
